Walled Garden

The enclosed walled garden, originally a Kitchen Garden, features walls that can be dated to the medieval period. In the 1980's, the 6th Earl Cawdor, designed and planted a holly maze, while Countess Angelika Cawdor planted her symbolic gardens and an orchard modelled after one mentioned in the archives from 1635.

Flower Garden

Originally laid out in the 1720's by Sir Archibald Campbell, son of the 15th Thane. Successive generations have left their mark, although very little of its layout and planting has changed.

Wild Garden

On the banks of the Cawdor Burn to the west of the Castle lies the Wild Garden, set out in the 1960's under the tall trees of the mid-19th century.

Big Wood

The Cawdor Big Wood is renowned as one of the finest broadleaf woodlands in Scotland and is among the few ancient woods left in Britain. It is globally valued for its lichen diversity, boasting over 240 different species.
